Christmas Eve and Christmas Day

Pastor's Article

"Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." Luke 2:10b-11 NRSV

It is our 151st year of celebrating the birth of Jesus as the congregation known as First United Methodist Church in Huntington. If you think about it, that almost five times as many years as Jesus walked upon this earth after his birth.

A lot has taken place since the birth of Jesus and even in the years since the birth of this congregation. We have seen bloody crusades, World Wars, countless small wars, so many natural disasters that we cannot count, plagues, and pandemics. We have also seen major innovations that the first century world could not even imagine in technology, travel, communication, and medicine. Sometimes it boggles my mind to think about everything that has changed in movie, no doubt you know of

the world just since my own birth, let alone since the birth of Christ.

That's why the words of the angels from Luke 2 above are still very important to us today as we celebrate Christmas 2022 and welcome in the new year of 2023. "Do not be afraid...I am bringing you good news of great joy for added). Good news of great joy for ALL. The angel did not have any idea who any of us were when those words were spoken and yet, these words are meant for us as much as they were meant for the shepherds who heard them

We have no reason to fear in this world, or if we do become afraid for some reason. we have not reason to remain in fear. God has sent us salvation. God has sent us a Savior. God has sent us our Lord – Jesus.

which I speak but for those who have not, suffice it to say that the title character is coerced to pray at a meal and insists that he can pray to the "Dear 8 pounds 6 ounces... newborn infant Jesus, don't even know a word yet..." and he proceeds to do so in hilarious fashion.

What this scene can re-ALL the people..." (emphasis mind us all is that that there is something about seeing Jesus as a baby that makes God relevant and close to ALL people. There is something about God becoming one of us in our most vulnerable states that can speak to ALL of us. That is Good News.

I pray you will do it as those who are willing to reach all those around you as much as God was willing to reach us – by becoming as vulnerable as a newborn to those who don't yet know Jesus.


