#### Not Quite Home – Stewardship Builds **YOUR Faith**

Summertime is one of our favorite times of the year. Summer sports. Leisure time from longer days. Travel and vacation. Many things come together to make summer a wonderful time.

However, summer can also be one of the most fruitful times for growing our own faith through the practice of "thankful generosity." As we count the blessings that God has given us from year to year and explore the wonderful creation God has entrusted to us, we can - if we so choose – to take a few moments to respond to God's generosity by being generous ourselves. Every time we do this, our faith grows because we put more faith in God ability to provide for us than our own ability to provide for ourselves.

There is one effect of faithful, generous giving that as a pastor I must emphasize to you – faithful, generous stewardship helps you more than it will ever help anyone else.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus makes a profound statement about money. He says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." I have no doubt that you have heard many sermons and many explanations on this passage, but I hope you will allow me to remind you of one more.

Jesus does not say, "Put you treasure where your heart is" or "Your heart will show you where to put your treasure." Jesus knew that as human beings our hearts can Pastor Scott be fickle at times. Jesus knew that we often need to teach ourselves how to best direct our hearts. So, he picked the one thing that we all

care about - our finances - and said, "Put your treasure in the place you want your heart to be!" He didn't say, "Find the things you love the most and put your treasure there." Jesus wanted our hearts to grow in generosity by admitting that it takes effort on our part to give to the church because that money may not benefit us directly it may fund mission or go to fund ministry done by others. And yet -faithful, generous stewardship helps you more than it will ever help anyone else.

As you take time this summer to not only enjoy life, but to give generously from all that God has given you, you will be making a profound step of faith. You are continuing to build your relationship with God by placing your treasure in a place you know God has been, is, and will be working in the future, First United Methodist Church. Huntington.

I know that these have been difficult economic times and for some of you giving to the church is hard right now. As your pastor, I want to encourage you to really, really, think about where you want your heart to be in six weeks, six months, or a year from now. Do you want it drawn closer to God? Then do what you need to do, for, as Jesus said: "Where your treasure is, THERE you heart will be also." Thank you for your faithful stewardship and for your prayerful consideration of how you can grow your heart even closer to God in the midst of this beautiful season of summer!

Description: "Dancing With God is an exploration of the divine gifts of courage and grace in the face of evil. Moreover, it is a doctrine of God as the source of that courage. Baker-Fletcher presents an understanding of the work of the Trinity with regard to the problem of crucifixion, a metaphor she uses for unnecessary violence. She develops a process of relational, womanist theology that considers the empathetic omnipresence of God in the midst of unnecessary suffering and the healing power of God in movement of the Holy Spirit."
