NOT QUITE HOME

In the Christmas classic, "It's a Wonderful Life", the main character George Bailey learns a powerful lesson about gratitude as he is given the opportunity to examine what the world would be like without his presence. It has become a classic for many reasons but perhaps the greatest of those is that the message of living in gratitude for even the broken things around us will change how we see the whole world – and especially our place in it.

On October 29th and November 5th, we will have a member of our congregation speak to us all about how gratitude has changed them. They will also speak briefly about how important it is to show our gratitude to God through faithful stewardship and committed giving to the church we call our "home." On team will be praying that we November 12th, Pastor Mark Conner, a pastor who has led this congregation in the past, will be with us to bring a special message on Gratitude and Giving. Our worship service will be followed by a catered meal in the Fellowship Hall.

Showing gratitude through giving is practiced in different ways these days, also. More giving is being done through Bill Pay and other direct gifts

to the church. As we go through our planning for 2024 and present this year's Stewardship campaign, I am encouraging everyone to be in prayer about the 2024 financial commitment that you will make to support the ministry of First UMC. Think about it in the terms of George Bailey - how will the church be changed by your gratitude through giving in the coming year?


