

Not Quite Home...

from Pastor Scott

Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Jesus said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him... Matthew 14:28-31a

I have really enjoyed preaching during this series "Wandering Heart - Figuring Out Faith with Peter". The material has been both refreshing and challenging. At times during the series, I really wish the material had come with prewritten sermons, but alas, they did not. I had to wrestle with the passages and the commentaries included (as well as those I am more familiar with in my library) to come up with the messages. Looking back on doing those messages, however, I am especially glad that they did not include sermons. The learning that I gained during the process is something that I now value. I was especially fond of the lesson from the second week of Lent that focused on the Scripture above. Like many people, whenever I read that story, I focused in upon Peter taking his eyes off Jesus and sinking in the stormy water around him. I wanted to somehow focus on Peter's failure.

The wrestling with the scripture that I did during this time, however, got me to focus on what is most important about the disciple Peter in this story - PETER ACTUALLY GOT OUT OF THE BOAT AND WALKED ON THE WATER TOWARD

JESUS! That is an incredible step of faith on be half of the disciple! It was something that had only been done by Jesus and as far as I know, has not been done since!

The story goes on to say that even after Peter got into some trouble while living out his faith in Jesus, Jesus was there in an instant to rescue him from danger.

All of this led me to believe that this lesson from the life of the disciple was a call to us as a congregation to find where Jesus was calling us to act on our faith in a new and powerful way - some way that may be risky and where we would have to trust in Jesus to rescue us if danger came our way. I feel it has to be something new, yet something we know Jesus cares about. It needs to be something that stretches our faith as far as possible.

I have waited on someone to be moved by the Spirit to share something that might be what God is calling us to do, but I have also been praying too. During this prayer and watching and listening, one question came to my mind that I just can't put aside. I want to share that question with you because I think it might be the start of some conversation that we can have about what God is calling us to do. 2024 West Virginia Annual Conference Goals

Recently, the Bishop's Cabinet met and established a set of goals for our Conference. This is something that hasn't been attempted in quite a while, but that has resulted in a true biblical vision for our conference to strive for through measurable and achievable goals. It provides the pathway for us to see the beauty in the desert and usher in the new life that exists just below the surface.

This goal-setting process has brought about a renewed sense of gladness and will result in tender stems of new life, buds that will blossom, and places and people who will take root, grow, and rejoice! How will we get there? Through three goals: Connection, Discipleship, and New Places New People. (Read the 2024 West Virginia Conference Goals)

Connection. Good things happen when we discover that we are better together. We have been able to feed, clothe, provide shelter and medical care - when we have connected and worked together. Congregations have connected to help close to 10 families from the Ukraine resettle and find new life in West Virginia. We have brought new life and hope by connecting with schools, first responders, hospitals, and other churches and outreach ministries in our communities in a variety of ways.

GOAL: We will build on the biblical vision and our value of connection in this new year. To strengthen our connection throughout the West Virginia Conference, we have a goal to equip and certify at least 10 lighthouse congregations.

These congregations will help us share best practices and learnings, and training resources with every congregation in the West Virginia Conference. You will hear more about this soon! (Check out this Portico course to learn more: <u>Lighthouse Congregations</u>)

Discipleship. Discipleship goes hand in hand with our value of connection. A second component of living into the biblical vision and a second goal in this new year necessarily addresses our call to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

GOAL: Because the world needs us to be more like Jesus, we will build upon the foundation of prayer to transition 49 current expressions of faith formation into the Wesleyan model of class meetings with a focus on the Bible.

The response to Dynamite Prayer in September was overwhelming! Prayer is the foundation upon which we build this goal. Wesley's class meeting style brings with it an emphasis on the Bible, more discussion than presentation, and accountability for growing in discipleship. This is a goal that can help Sunday School classes, small groups, and other faith formation groups to "kick it up" a notch for Jesus!

New Places, New People. Our third Conference goal builds upon what has already begun and acknowledges that God is already at work among us.

GOAL: In response to Jesus' call for us to go where people are, we will equip, resource, and support the launching 15 New Places, New People efforts connected to existing congregations/charges.

This goal relates to both connection and discipleship as New Places, New People efforts strengthen both - our connection with one another and the communities we serve and discipleship as we intentionally reach new people for Christ.

Yes, these goals provide a clear biblical vision. One where I see the wild and wonderful hills and valley of West Virginia and Garrett County Maryland come alive with new growth, with tender shoots, and new blossoms. It is a vision in the midst of a challenging world that calls us to move through the challenges and into gladness - for indeed the Lord, Jesus Christ, is and will do great things among us. It is a vision of hope, promise, and new life!

Mother Teresa once said, "Prayer changes us; we change the world." May we pray together and live into the Biblical Vision that is as fresh, relevant, glad, and powerful today as it was in the

time of Isaiah! May it be so!

Mission Update





Plan now to attend. Bring your gifts and donated goods and meet the Mission directors. There will be musicians from several churches and desserts to eat and desserts to buy. The needs lists for Ebenezer Outreach, House of the Carpenter, and Volunteers in Mission are to be found throughout the church.

EBENEZER OUTREACH: Well, it is official. The working plans are complete and a timetable is being completed for the first phase of the building - the gymnasium. When it is complete, over 30 after school students will have room enough to study and play and the community room will be available to serve the community. The Board is working on fund raising ideas and would welcome ideas and expertise. Director Celes Sheffield reported that presently there are 67 children enrolled. The building has updated air conditioning and passed the fire marshal's inspection. This summer the children will once again be attending Bible School at Steele Memorial. We will be providing cookies for the Easter party on April 28.

Celes also needs a 7-passenger van for all the trips she takes around the Conference, for speaking engagements, training, and ingatherings. Her car is beyond making those trips. Anybody out there have a van for Ebenezer??

SUNFLOWER: The Tri-state area is blessed to have a new 501C3 charity - SUNFLOWERS SEEDS INC. - organized right here. This is not a political agency. It is an humanitarian agency - reaching out to the victims of the war in Ukraine. The people of Ukraine did not ask for war, but Putin is determined to restore the Russian empire. The results of that greed are:

- over 15 million Ukrainians are displaced both within and outside the country.

- about 13 million are stranded within the battle areas
- most refugees are women and children

- 700,000 Ukrainian children have "disappeared " within Russia

What can we do to ease the suffering? We can pray. Through SUNFLOWER, we can send life-saving food and medical supplies to the victims of this senseless war. We can participate in SUNFLOWER activities. The first is a community run on May 18. Watch for more.

RISE: 10,000 meals filled and packed in less than 3 hours! WOW! Now that's mission - a roomful of happy people serving as God's hands on earth.

FACING HUNGER FOODBANK: needs volunteers to fill backpacks, senior boxes, medical boxes, make mobile deliveries, and fulfill office duties. With only 2 food banks in WV, Facing Hunger serves 42% of the hungry people. That is amazing since Facing Hunger serves only 12 of WV's 55 counties.

-In 2023, Facing Hunger provided over 8,000,000 meals or 11 million pounds.

-Facing Hunger provides food to over 300 feeding agencies

- One out of four WV children is food insecure

-Facing Hunger also serves 4 counties in KY and Lawrence in Ohio.




