A Few Words from Pastor Scott

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus makes a profound statement about money. He says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Of course, many people attempt to deflect what Jesus is saying here away from "money" to being about other things that we treasure – family, freedom, etc. – however, the context of Jesus' words are quite clear: Jesus was talking about money. I realize that this can be a touchy subject for some people, but it is impossible to ignore as one of the things Jesus taught the disciples. Nearly 15% of everything Jesus spoke about had to do with money, so if I mention it in a single newsletter article, I am just striving to get to that mark.

Jesus does not say, "Search your heart and figure out where to put your money" or "Find the things you love and put your money there." Jesus knew that as human beings we often need to teach ourselves how to best control our hearts. So, he picked the one thing that we all care about – our money – and said, "Put your treasure in the place you want your heart to be!"

Every person who becomes a member of the United Methodist Church stands before their particular congregation and makes a vow before God and the congregation to support it with their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Since "service" would obviously use the spiritual gifts that are given by the Holy Spirit, the word gifts in this context must refer to our financial gifts. Biblically, there is a long held understanding that a tenth of everything that we have belongs to God and should be presented to God in the sanctuary (Malachi 3:8-12). Some

people hold to the belief that this tithe can be broken between "good causes" that serve God. As for me and my house, we bring our tithe to the church we are serving, because, well, I will trust that church to find the good causes with which to use it.

This is heavy teaching for a summer edition of the newsletter, and I understand that, but it is also a timely one. As we entered into the month of July we were over \$12,000 behind our giving levels for 2023 and we are nowhere near paying our fair share of the Annual Conference's Mission and Ministry Budget for 2024.

So, as a pastor, I am simply asking you to reflect upon Jesus words this month – "Where your treasure is there your heart will be also" – and really think about what you are doing. The simple act of giving a tithe to your church will help you love that church more, care for that church more, and be involved in that church more. Jesus knew what he was talking about. As we put our money towards something, we love it more and in loving it, we become "invested".

And truthfully, I can think of nothing better for you to love. First United Methodist Church has a legacy of reaching out to its community, of offering quality programs to its members, and of creating disciples who are transforming the world around them. *Don't you want to love that with all you can?*

I do and I will.



Narcotics Anonymous meetings take place every Friday night from 6:30-9:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.




Cridlin Pantry
