Not Quite Home ...

In those days Caesar Augustus declared that everyone throughout the empire should be enrolled in the tax lists. This first enrollment occurred when Quirinius governed Syria. Luke 2:1-2

I am sure that most people - especially those of us prone to be in churches - have heard these verses read around the Christmas Season. But even beyond the normal church crowd, when the story of Jesus' birth is told, Luke's gospel is the most popular and even then, these two verses are not left out. I believe that most people think they are there to give a historical marker to the story. This is very problematic since not much is known about the exact times Quirinius was "governing" (the Common English Bible gives a really accurate and non-specific translation of the Greek word there) or about how the Judeans would respond to such a decree during a time that is not exactly known. For instance, we know that during an earlier attempt to "enroll" people, up to 6,000 members of the Pharisees refused to participate because they had to declare Caesar as "father of the country."

If we try to use these two verses to nail down the exact time of Jesus' birth, it is difficult at best and would require huge leaps of faith or conjecture that history just doesn't provide.

What we can know for certain from the inclusion of these verses is that Luke intended us to see that even while the powerful sat on their thrones and used power to govern and order people around, God was at work preparing to upset the whole power structure. The Son of God was about to enter this world in the humble setting of a stable. That is very important for us to recall this Christmas Season.

It is easy to believe that we can identify the powerful by how much they are able to accomplish

in ordering people and setting up structures that keep people in the proper social order.

God was having nothing to do with that as God sent salvation to earth. Instead, God turned everything topsy-turvy and said, "If you want to see the most powerful One in the universe, look for a baby wrapped in cloth and lying in a manger."

This is an important reminder for us this Christmas and every Christmas because it can keep us from getting wrapped up in all the wrong things. It can keep us from losing focus on what God is preparing to do even today. Constantly looking at the baby in the manger reminds us that the omnipotent God decided that humility was the best way to show power.

I do hope and pray that you have a blessed Christmas this year. I hope your celebration turns out close enough to what you imagined it would be that you find joy and happiness in its celebration. However, if you find that things go sideways, if you discover that things you hoped for and worked towards don't go exactly as you had planned and directed in your mind, if things just suddenly go topsy-turvy on you, then remember this story: the power this world thinks it has is an illusion that is shattered by the cry of a baby in the manger. Caesar, Quirinius, and whoever else was ruling at the time could not overcome the humble work of God in bringing the greatest gift this world has ever received – Jesus.

Merry Christmas everyone!! May it be filled with humble presence of Christ and the joy of Jesus' presence among your presents!
